

Double Handed Championship

Two handed racing is becoming increasingly popular due to its simplicity. The Perie Banou Trophy, named after WA's famous single handed circumnavigator Jon Sanders and his yacht Perie Banou, will be awarded to the winner. Most races are short and are sailed in daylight, including port stopover races like the Rockingham and Mandurah weekends.

The Double Handed Championship requires boats to comply with YA Category 3 Offshore Regulations.

The races will be sailed under both YAH handicapping system and IRC, with separate results for each system. YAH makes it affordable and simple for any boat to be certified. IRC now allows a boat to hold a second, short-handed certificate along with its normal certificate.

Evolution Sails Blue Water Championship

The Evolution Sails Blue Water Championship is true offshore racing at its challenging best. Boats compete over a 7 race series comprised of WA's premier offshore races. The overall IRC winner is awarded the Siska Trophy and crowned WA's Evolution Sails Blue Water Champion.

The Blue Water Fleet requires boats to comply with YA Category 2 & 3 Offshore Regulations. Typically, the boats are capable of sailing races in excess of 200 nautical miles.

Crews should be competent and 30% of a boat's team should hold a current Safety and Sea Survival Certificate.

While this fleet races across our vast Indian Ocean, Yacht Trackers allow family and friends to log on to the host club web site and follow the progress of all racing teams and even get live blogs and updates from on board.

For the first time in 2011/12, competitors will be able to contest a higher tier race and receive average points in a concurrent race in their usual series.

The Archambault Offshore Championship brings the thrill of racing along our coast combined with some great overnight stopovers at fun ports. Boats compete over an 11 race series in races that are generally closer to shore and run in daylight.

The overall IRC winner, with 8 races to count from the 11 race series, is awarded the Archambault Offshore trophy. For the first time in 2011/12, each race will feature overall winners who can come from either division.

The Archambault Offshore Championship requires boats to comply with YA Category 3 & 4 Offshore Regulations.

River based boats will find the Archambault Offshore Championship particularly attractive as with races mostly in daylight hours, there is ample time to commute from a river based club or mooring to the start line off Rous Head.
